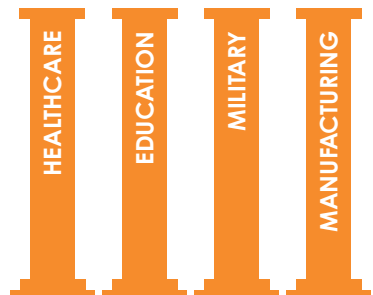

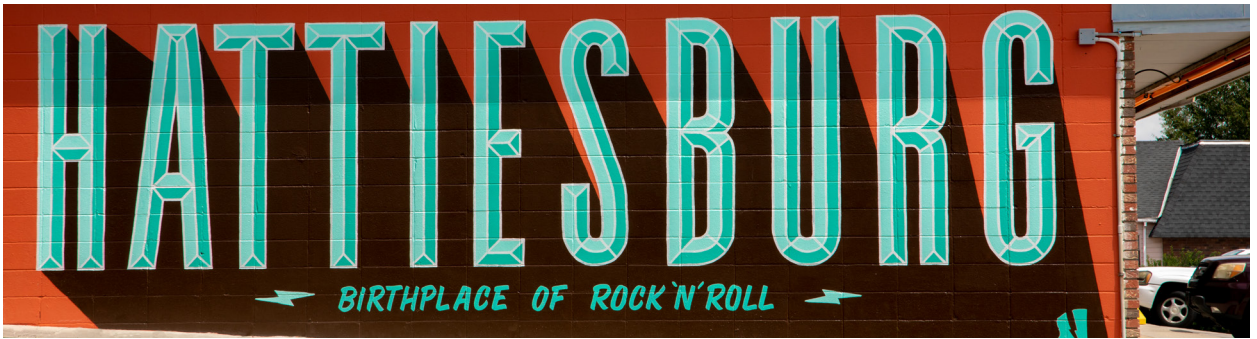

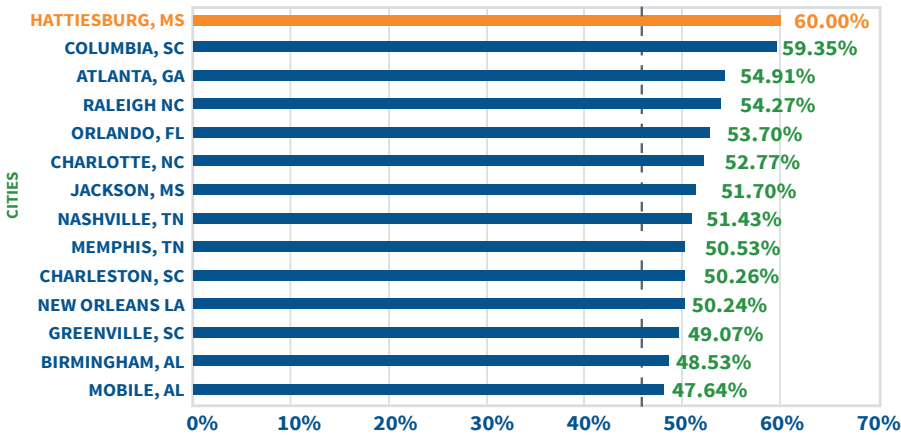

YOUNG TALENT AS % OF POPULATION

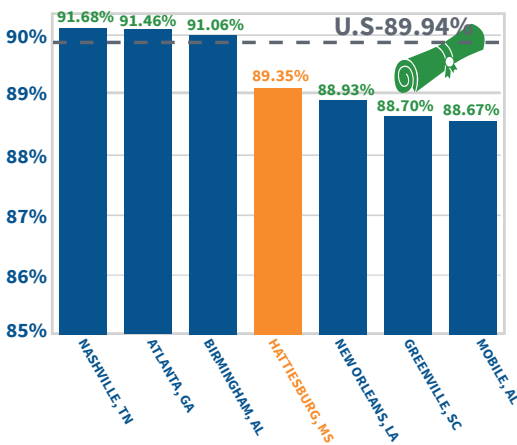

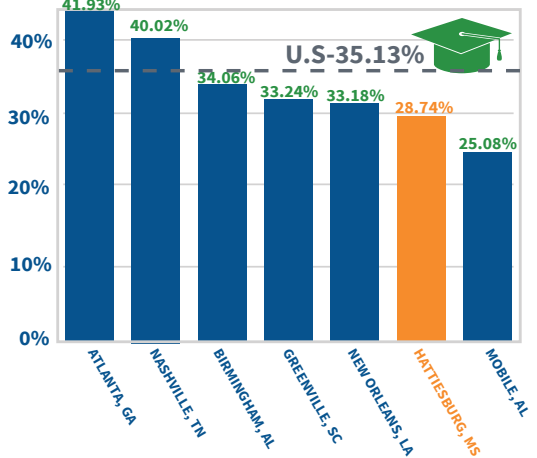

AGE 25+ BACHELOR'S DEGREE OR HIGHER



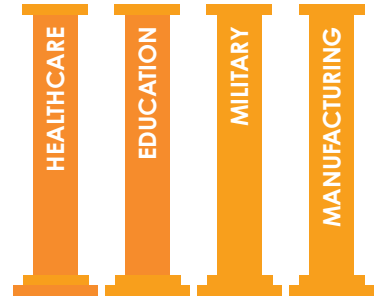

Diverse Business

Many diverse businesses and industries call Greater Hattiesburg home, ranging from small businesses to international corporations. These businesses are sustained by a strong economic base made up of four pillars: Education, Healthcare, Military, and Manufacturing. Each of these economic sectors brings diversity and vitality to Greater Hattiesburg, as many students and educators, healthcare providers, military families, and manufacturing workers reside in Greater Hattiesburg.

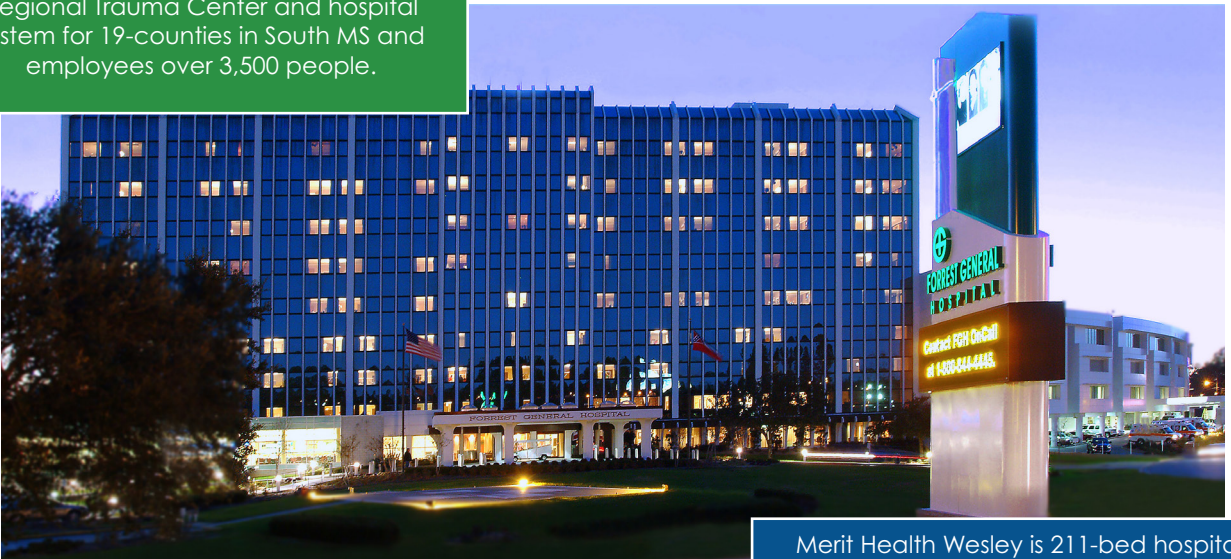
FOUR PILLARS



Healthcare

Greater Hattiesburg is THE medical hub of South Mississippi, servicing a broad region of 19 counties. In total, the region boasts over 300 medical care companies, with two major hospitals encompassing 723 hospital beds. Hattiesburg is also home to the largest multi-specialty clinic in the state of Mississippi. Healthcare comprises 16% of the regional economy with more than 11,000 direct employees.

Forrest General is a 547-bed, Level II Regional Trauma Center and hospital system for 19-counties in South MS and employees over 3,500 people.



Merit Health Wesley is 211-bed hospital nationally recognized for patient safety and quality care.



Hattiesburg Clinic is Mississippi's largest multi-specialty health clinic. Headquartered in Hattiesburg and employing over 2,200.



Education

The region's education sector contains approximately 7,400 direct employees in K-12 and higher education. The Greater Hattiesburg MSA is home to two major universities, two community colleges, and eight primary and secondary education districts.

Hattiesburg is continually seeking ways to aid its citizens in obtaining the skills and knowledge needed in today's global economy. Top-tier university research facilities, partnerships, and innovative workforce development initiatives fuel the Hattiesburg economy towards long-term growth.



The Greater Hattiesburg MSA has over 26,000 college students within a 30 mile radius.

Military

With over 1,000 personnel and 136,000 acres of maneuvering space, Camp Shelby is a major player in the local economy. National Guard Battalions from all over the nation return to Hattiesburg annually for the state-of-the-art training facilities offered at Camp Shelby.

The Mississippi Gulf Coast, just 70 miles south of Hattiesburg, is home to Keesler Air Force Base, the Naval Construction Battalion Center Gulfport, Stennis Space Center, Northrop Grumman, Lockheed Martin, and more.



Camp Shelby is the largest state-owned military base in the U.S. serving around 100,000 personnel annually and employing over 1,000 people.

Manufacturing

Companies from around the world have chosen to craft their products in Hattiesburg because of its diverse and robust logistics network, its pro-business government approach, and most importantly, a highly skilled workforce built on the backbone of a strong work ethic.

Whether it's Kohler manufacturing world-class engines or Sofidel producing paper consumer products, or Oxiteno doing chemical research and development, Hattiesburg's diverse industry sector provides stable employment opportunities across a wide variety of industries.



Sofidel America is the 5th largest paper company in the world and employees over 150 people in the Forrest County Industrial Park.

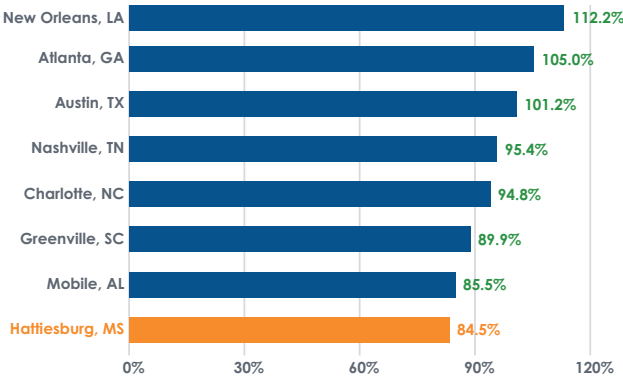

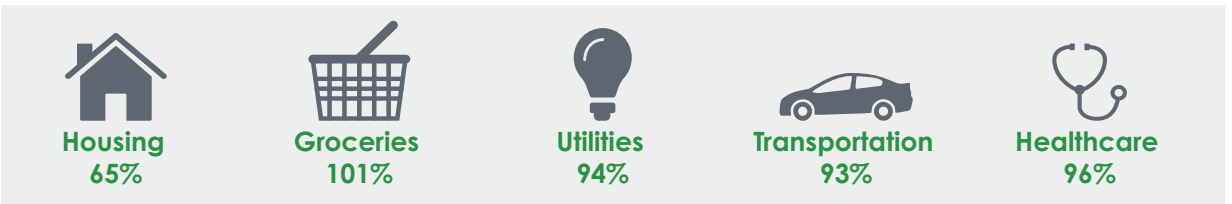
COST OF LIVING

TAXES

Mississippi businesses are subject to four major taxes: corporate income tax, franchise tax, sales and use tax and property tax. Tax credits or exemptions are available for qualified companies regarding income, sales and use, franchise and property taxes.

The State of Mississippi exempts sales tax on energy used in manufacturing.

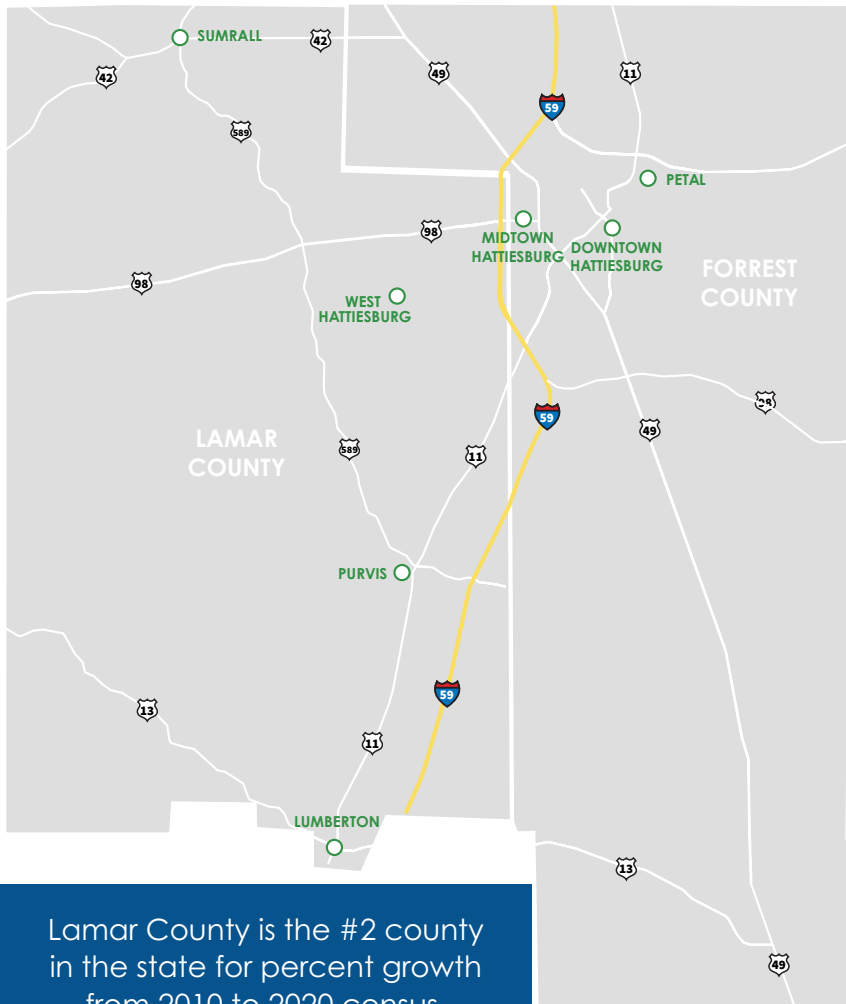
RETIREMENT

Greater Hattiesburg has distinguished itself as a premier destination for those looking for a place to retire. Hattiesburg has been designated a “Certified Retirement Community” by Hometown Mississippi Retirement, a state-sponsored program designed to recruit retirees to the state.

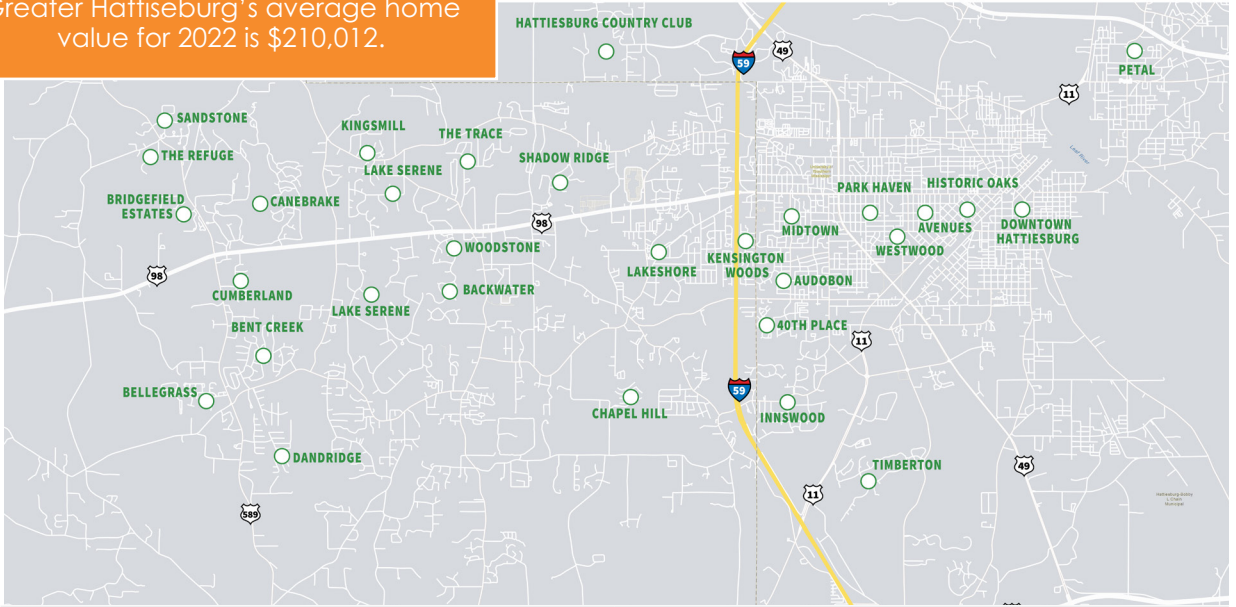

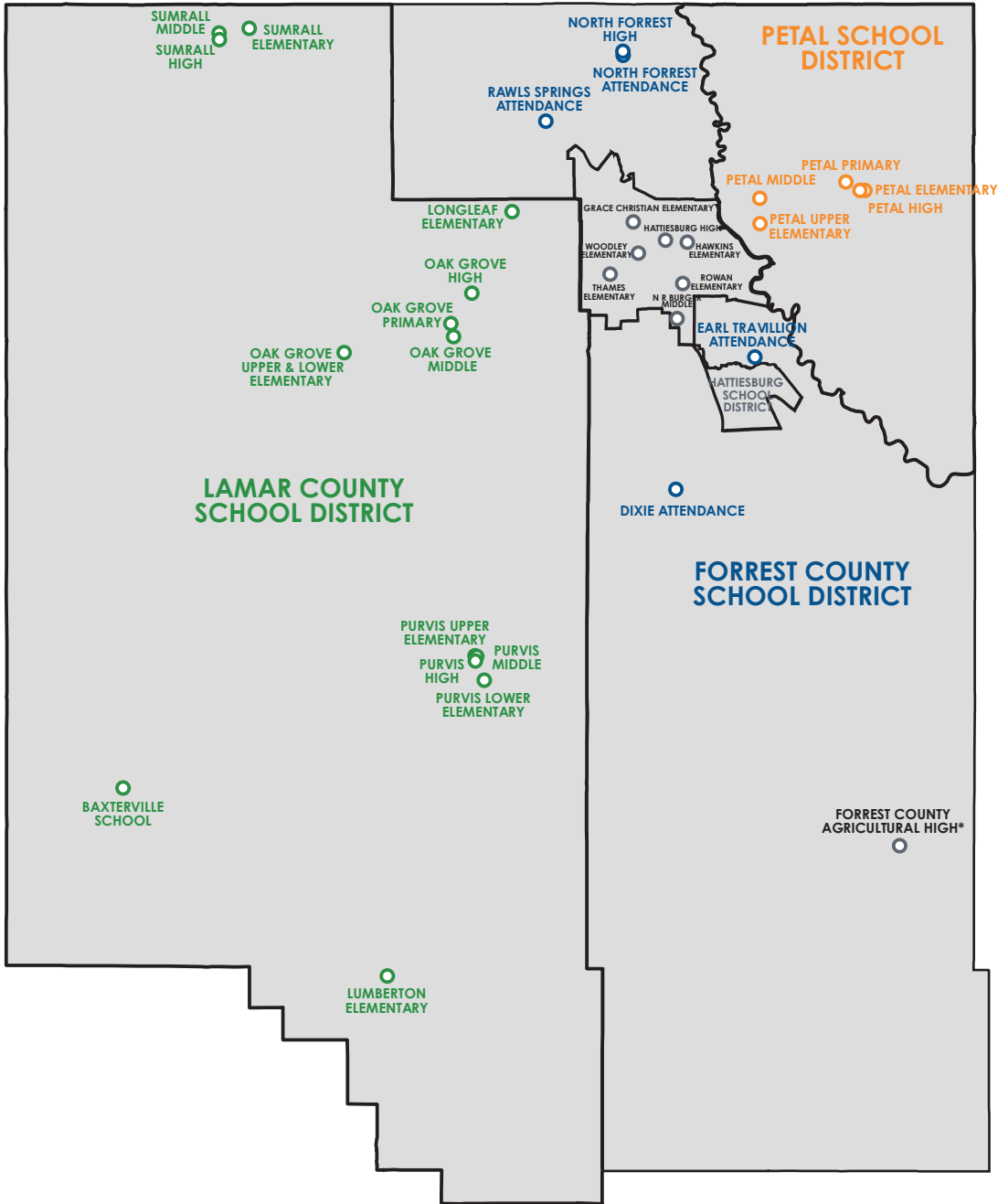
The Hattiesburg area has approximately 50 apartment complexes throughout the region and includes everything from budget-friendly shared living spaces for students to professional and family housing.

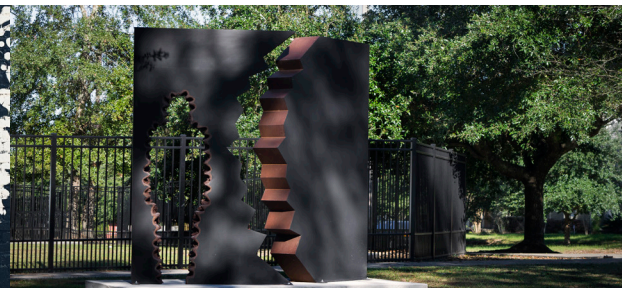

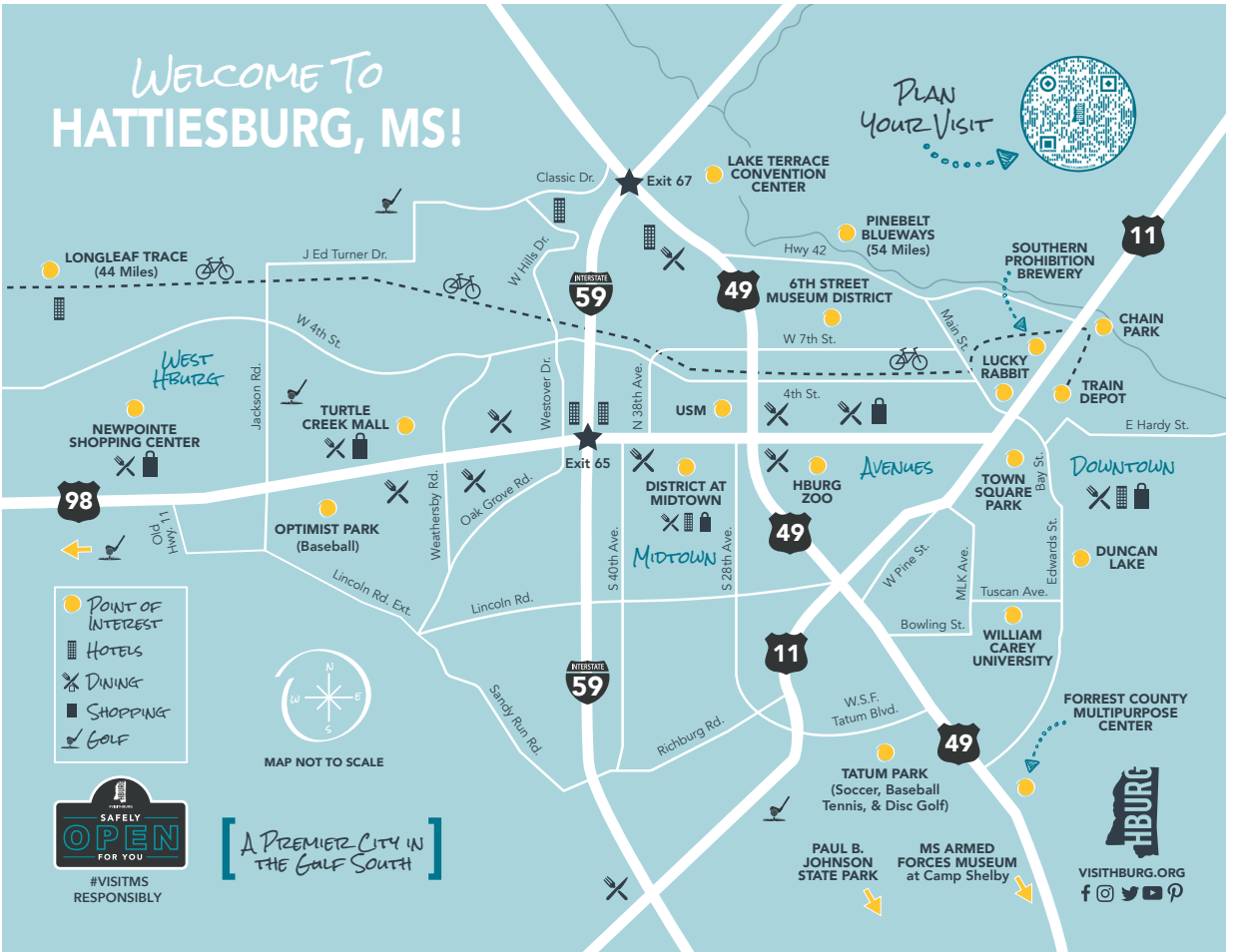
SHOPPING, DINING & NIGHTLIFE

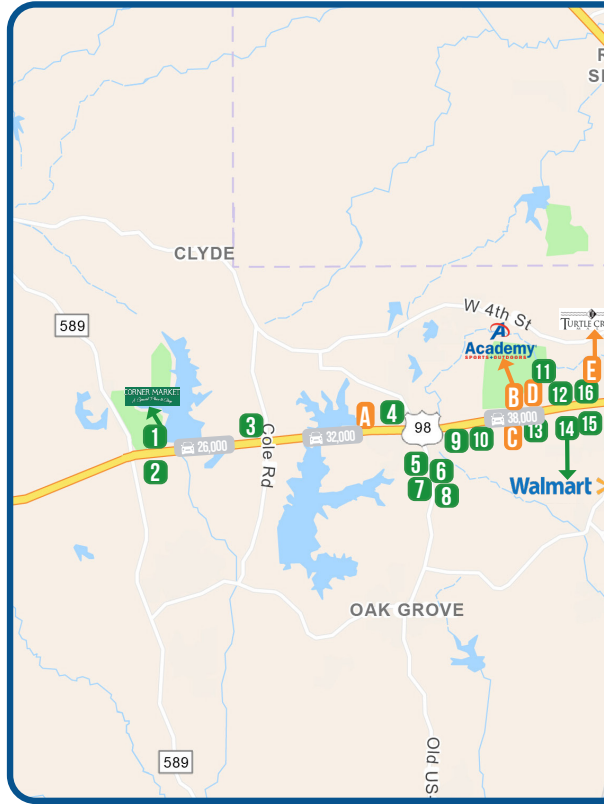

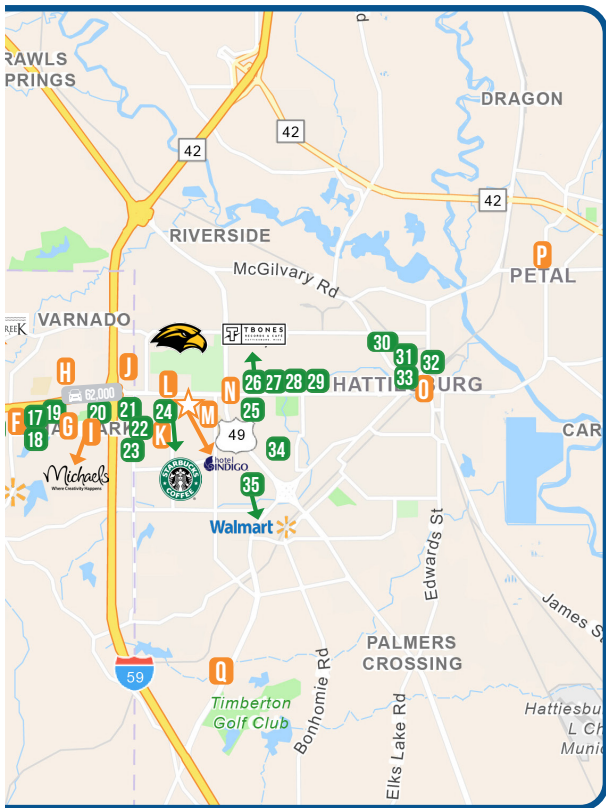
